Our 2019 **Wheels of Hope Car Show** was a great success, raising awareness of Hope Clinic and generating almost \$50,000.00 for ongoing medical assistance.



First Baptist Church of Garland's G.I.F.T. Sunday School Class delivered the first **Patient Kits** to Hope Clinic, a new ancillary project dedicated to providing a variety of useful hygiene and dental products to patients.

At the 2019 **Celebration of Hope**, we raised \$103,150.00. Our distinguished speaker, Mr. LaMonte Thomas of Cigna Corporation, delivered a compassionate message about equality for all in healthcare.

Our major effort during last year was addressing the capital improvement of our clinical area: expanded physician's area; restructured the physical layout of five exam rooms to ensure privacy; upgraded the play area in our lobby for our patients' children.

A new way of caring was launched last year called our clinic's **Hope at Home**. Our volunteers visit a patient's home who is unable to physically return to Hope Clinic for regular appointments.



Hope Clinic launched the arduous approval process to become a **Texas Health and Human Services satellite** through the state's Community Partner Program. Our commitment was providing wraparound services for long term stability against social determinants.

Our **Community Services Division** helped 251 Hope Clinic patients and 457 non-patients with basic needs assistance through cooperation with other local non-profits.

With the help of our generous sponsors, this year's **North Texas Giving Day** was a great success and we raised over \$30,000.00 to continue providing healthcare to the underserved in and around Garland.

In July 2019, Hope Clinic became a partner with the **New Eyes for the Needy Program**, a nonprofit that provides free glasses for the needy, both in the US and abroad.

Catholic Charities held its first ever **Food Drive Day for Hope Clinic's patients** and community families. 97 families received an assortment of meats, vegetables, and dry food products to their delight.

In October, our Chairman Mark King signed an agreement along with Dr. Fred Cerise, Parkland Health's President/CEO, granting Hope Clinic a multi-year award of \$500,000. Hope Clinic's commitment is to continue providing much needed primary health care and resources for healthy living to the underserved population.

The Great Story of Hope

Our story began in 2001 as a vision of Martha Sanford, RN, PhD, and Jim Witt, Missions Pastor from First Baptist Garland. By 2002 Friendship House Health Ministries, now known as Hope Clinic of Garland, began seeing a few patients one night per week in a room located inside the Friendship House. The medical care was provided by Dr. Jennifer Kampas, who is still an active physician for the clinic and also serves as the Medical Director. Now, almost 20 years later, Hope Clinic continues providing quality care, diagnostics/testing and prescription assistance for over 7,500 patient visits a year.
